

MTSU Job-Embedded Licensure Program Entry Requirements

1. Have a bachelor's degree from an appropriately accredited college or university.
2. Demonstrate content knowledge with a degree in the content area **OR** through submission of a passing score on the required content assessment(s) for the endorsement area.

Applicants seeking an endorsement in the table below **may be exempt** from the assessment requirement **if** they possess a degree in the content area for the endorsement (e.g., a B.S. in Mathematics degree seeking a Mathematics endorsement):
